Proposed Constitution amendment-

Last AGM the committee mooted to amend/add to the constitution a means by which the real estate assets of the Residents association could be protected. With consultation with Lindsay Lloyd- solicitor the following is proposed and will be voted on this AGM.

11A. Acquisition or Disposal of Real Property

a) A special resolution for the specific purpose of the Association purchasing or disposing of real property shall be required and it may be passed at a general or special meeting in accordance with Rules 4(g) and 10 of this constitution, subject to the following provision which prevails over any other rules:

i) Voting

For a special resolution to pass for the purpose contemplated by rule 11A (a) noted above, 60% of all Ordinary Members (whether voting in person at the meeting or by proxy) must vote in favour of the resolution.

HOW DOES THE NEW NAVIGATION SAFETY BYLAW AFFECT YOU?



IF YOU ARE IN A NON-POWERED VESSEL 6M OR LESS IN LENGTH, OR A PADDLE CRAFT, OR SOLELY POWERED BY OARS:

You must have the current owner's name and address somewhere on the vessel. It can be as simple as writing it with marker pen inside the hull.

IF YOUR BOAT IS TOWED ON A TRAILER YOU SHOULD:

Have the registration number of the trailer on each side of the vessel, and it must be at least 90mm high. It has to be seen in daylight from 50m away – this could be a sticker with a colour that contrasts with your boat's hull



IF YOUR BOAT ISN'T TOWED ON A TRAILER:

You must display a unique identifying name and/or number either side of the hull.



If you belong to a sporting body check with your organisation or Environment Canterbury as your organisation's ID system may have already been approved by the Harbourmaster's Office. If already approved, it can be used instead of your trailer rego.

If you have an existing Maritime NZ registration number or a radio call sign, then this can be displayed.

Remember, if you don't sort out the identification on your boat, you may face enforcement action.

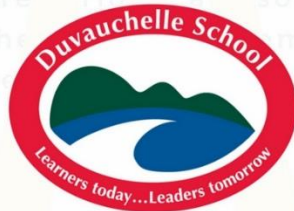
